	Whereas, the voters of Missouri approved a constitutional amendment in 1994 which
2 3 4	created a commission charged with setting the amount of compensation paid to statewide elected officials, legislators and judges; and
5	Whereas, prior to the approval of this amendment, the General Assembly had the duty and
6 7	responsibility of setting salaries; and
8	\mathbf{W} hereas, the Missouri Citizen's Commission on Compensation for Elected Officials has
9 10 11	recommended that salaries be increased for certain judges and has recommended cost-of-living salary increases for judges, statewide elected officials and legislators; and
12	Whereas, the recommended cost-of-living increases are five and one-half percent for each
13 14 15	of the next two years, at a time when the average annual inflation is less than three and one-half percent; and
16	Whereas, the recommended increases are substantially higher than the Governor's
17 18	expected recommendation of a two percent cost-of-living adjustment for state employees; and
19	Whereas, the changes recommended by the Missouri Citizen's Commission on
20 21 22	Compensation for Elected Officials will take effect on July 1, 2001, unless disapproved by the General Assembly; and
23	Whereas, the General Assembly may disapprove of the recommendation by a concurrent
24 25	resolution approved by both the Senate and the House of Representatives before February 1, 2001:

26	Now, therefore, be it resolved by the members of the House of Representatives
27	of the Ninety-first General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, that the
28	recommendations of the Missouri Citizen's Commission on Compensation of Elected Officials be
29	disapproved; and
