AN ACT

To repeal section 226.030, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the powers and duties of the state transportation commission.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 226.030, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 226.030, to read as follows:

226.030. [The state highways and transportation commission shall consist of six members, who shall be appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, not more than three thereof to be members of the same political party. Each commissioner shall be a taxpayer and resident of state for at least five years prior to his appointment. Any commissioner may be removed by the governor if fully satisfied of his inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct in office. All commissioners appointed prior to October 13, 1965, shall serve the term for which they were appointed. Commissioners appointed pursuant to this section shall be appointed for terms of six years. Upon the expiration of each of the foregoing terms of these commissioners a successor shall be appointed for a term of six years or until his successor is appointed and qualified which term of six years shall thereafter be the length of term of each member of the commission unless removed as above provided. The members of the commission shall receive as compensation for their services twenty-five dollars

traveling and other expenses incurred while actually engaged in the discharge of their official 15 duties. 11. A state highways and transportation commission appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, shall consist of six members appointed to six-17 year terms, except that the present members of the state highways and transportation commission shall serve for the remainder of their terms as follows: members whose terms 18 19 otherwise expire December 1, 2003, shall serve with terms expiring July 1, 2004; a member whose term otherwise expires December 1, 2005, shall serve with a term expiring July 1, 20 21 2006; a member whose term otherwise expires December 1, 2007, shall serve with a term 22 expiring July 1, 2008; and of the members whose terms otherwise expire October 13, 2007, 23 one member shall serve with a term expiring July 1, 2006, and the other member shall 24 serve with a term expiring July 1, 2008, as determined by the governor. The house and 25 senate leadership, which shall mean the speaker of the house of representatives, the 26 president pro tempore of the senate, and the minority floor leaders of the house and of the 27 senate, from the same political party shall by party supply three candidates to the governor for selection as members of the commission. The governor shall select one candidate from 28 29 each party. The candidates shall be appointed by July first in even-numbered years. In 30 the event of a vacancy on the commission, the house and senate leadership of that political party of the vacating member shall submit three candidates for selection as a member to 31 32 the commission to the governor within thirty days of the vacancy. The governor shall have 33 fifteen days to select a new member of the commission. The new member of the 34 commission shall serve only the remainder of the unexpired six-year term of the vacating 35 member.

- 2. No more than one-half of the members of the state highways and transportation commission shall be of the same political party, excluding ex officio members of the transportation commission. No member of the transportation commission shall directly or indirectly make any contribution to or hold any office in a political party or organization, or take part in any political campaign. The selection and removal of all employees of the department of highways and transportation shall be without regard to political affiliation.
- 3. The present members of the state highways and transportation commission shall serve as members of the state highways and transportation commission for the remainder of the terms for which they were appointed, except as provided in subsection 2 of this section.
