	Whereas, a permanent electronic identification device to track all red meat-
2	producing livestock from farm to table would be a great protective device for anti-bioterrorism;
3	and

5	Whereas, such devices would be useful to the producers of red meat-producing
6	livestock in controlling diseases as a method of tracing such livestock back to the farm; and
7	
8	Whereas, such devices would be beneficial in providing producers with livestock
9	carcass information, including the rate of gain; and
10	
11	Whereas, such devices would be most useful in generating information on the
12	concept of "farm to table" to protect American consumers:

14	Now, therefore, be it resolved that the members of the House of
15	Representatives of the Ninety-second General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate
16	concurring therein, hereby encourage the Animal and Plant Inspection Service of the United
17	States Department of Agriculture to develop and promulgate a permanent electronic
18	identification program to be used on all red meat-producing livestock that would gather
19	information and help protect the United States' consumer in the event of a bioterrorist threat; and

21	Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
22	Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the
23	United States Department of Agriculture.
