	Whereas, good health is important to every citizen of the world and access to the
2 3 4	highest standards of health information and services is necessary to improve the public health; and
5	$Whereas, {\it direct and unobstructed participation in international health cooperation}$
6 7 8 9	forums and programs is beneficial for all parts of the world, especially today with the great potential for the cross-border spread of various infectious diseases such as the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), tuberculosis, and malaria; and
10	Whereas, Taiwan's population of 23,500,000 people is greater than three-fourths
11 12	of the member states already in the World Health Organization (WHO); and
13 14	Whereas, Taiwan's achievements in the field of health are substantial, including:
14 15 16 17	(1) Attaining one of the highest life expectancy levels in Asia, and maternal and infant mortality rates comparable to those of western countries; and
18 19	(2) Eradicating such infectious diseases as cholera, smallpox, the plague, and polio; and
20 21	(3) Providing children with hepatitis B vaccinations; and
22	Whereas, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and its
23 24 25	counterpart agencies in Taiwan have enjoyed close collaboration on a wide range of public health issues; and

26	Whereas, in recent years Taiwan has expressed a willingness to assist financially
27 28	and technically in international aid and health activities supported by the WHO; and
29	Whereas, on January 14, 2001, an earthquake, registering between 7.6 and 7.9 of
30 31 32 33 34	the Richter scale, struck El Salvador. In response, the Taiwanese Government sent two rescue teams, consisting of ninety individuals specializing in firefighting, medicine, and civil engineering. The Taiwanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs also donated \$200,000 in relief aid to the Salvadoran Government; and
35	Whereas, the World Health Assembly has allowed observers to participate in the
36 37 38	activities of the organization, including the Palestine Liberation Organization in 1974, the Order of Malta, and the Holy See in the early 1950s; and
39	Whereas, the United States, in the 1994 Taiwan Policy Review, declared its
40 41	intention to support Taiwan's participation in appropriate international organizations; and
42	Whereas, in light of all benefits that Taiwan's participation in WHO can bring to
43 44 45	the state of health not only in Taiwan, but also regionally and globally, Taiwan and its 23,500,000 people should have appropriate and meaningful participation in the WHO; and
46	Whereas, in 2003, the outbreak of Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS)
47 48	caused 73 deaths in Taiwan; and
49	Whereas, avian influenza, commonly known as bird flu, has reemerged in Asia,
50 51 52	with strains of the influenza reported by the People's Republic of China, Cambodia, Indonesia, Japan, Pakistan, South Korea, Taiwan, Thailand, Vietnam, and Laos; and

53	Whereas, the SARS and avian influenza outbreaks illustrate that disease knows
33	V IICI CAS, the SARS and avian influenza outbreaks mustrate that disease knows
54	no boundaries and emphasize the importance of allowing all people access to the WHO; and

56	Whereas, as the pace of globalization quickens and the spread of infectious disease
57	accelerates, it is crucial that all people, including the people of Taiwan, be given the opportunity
58	to participate in international health organizations such as the WHO:

60	Now, therefore, be it resolved that the members of the House of
61	Representatives of the Ninety-second General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate
62	concurring therein, hereby support observer status for Taiwan at the annual week-long summit
63	of the World Health Assembly (WHA) held by the World Health Organization (WHO) in May
64	of each year in Geneva, Switzerland; and

66	Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
67	Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the
68	World Health Organization.
