FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** indicated that the proposal would have no direct fiscal effect on their organization.

In response to a similar proposal in a prior session, officials of the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** indicated that the proposal would have no direct fiscal effect on their agency.

Oversight notes that since this proposal would directly ratify an amendment to the United States Constitution, it only requires approval by the General Assembly. There would be no requirement for a statewide vote; therefore there would be no direct fiscal impact.
