Officials of the **Department of Economic Development- Division of Tourism** assume no fiscal impact.

Officials of the City of Concordia assume the guest tax would generate revenues as follows:

FY 2005 - \$34,605; FY 2006 - \$47,525; and FY 2007 - \$48,950. Officials assume revenue could only be spent on the promotion of tourism. Officials stated there estimates were based on a 5% tax.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This bill allows the City of Concordia to impose a tourism tax on all hotel and motel rooms within the city. The tax cannot exceed 5% per room per night, and all proceeds from the tax must be used to promote tourism.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
