## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small businesses that do not have their addresses displayed may be fiscally impacted by the proposal since they are now required to do so.

## **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal requires all residences and commercial businesses to display their street addresses in a manner that they are clearly visible and easily readable, day or night, from all adjoining roadways.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
