FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Public Service Commission** (**PSC**) state the proposal would permit the City of Springfield to sell utility services outside of the city at the same rates charged inside the city. Any potential impact to the PSC would be minimal and could be absorbed within current agency resources.

Oversight assumes this proposal is discretionary and does not require the City of Springfield to sell utility services outside the city limits, therefore, fiscal impact would be zero.
