#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education - Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing** stated that this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education (DHE)** indicated that the proposal is unclear as to what is required by DHE and higher education institutions for the encouragement of the teaching, study, and learning of American Sign Language. It is not clear to DHE if this encouragement will equate to additional programs in American Sign Language, which could have a significant fiscal impact.

**Oversight** assumes that since the language in the proposal is permissive, no fiscal impact will be assigned.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

## **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal recognizes American Sign Language as a language and encourages its teaching and study. Students may receive academic credit for demonstrating proficiency, take courses for academic credit, receive foreign language credit for the courses, and meet foreign language entrance requirements with the courses. The proposal requires that only qualified persons be employed to teach this language in Missouri schools and requires the Missouri Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, upon request, to assist in the development and teaching of courses.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
