FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This bill prohibits political subdivisions from enacting or enforcing any ordinance that does not comply with the limited preemption of the Federal Communications Commission Amateur Radio Preemption order. Any ordinance relating to the placement, screening, or height of an amateur radio antenna based on health, safety, or aesthetic considerations must reasonably accommodate amateur communications and be of minimal practicable regulation.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
