### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** (DESE) assume this proposal could result in significant savings to school districts by reducing labor costs included in construction contracts. DESE estimated that saving 15% on future construction costs would amount to as much as \$600 million in the future.

**Oversight** assumes that future school district construction costs and any potential savings from eliminating the state prevailing wage requirement on school district projects are speculative and subject to many other factors. Oversight is unable to identify any specific cost or savings which would result directly from this proposal.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal could impact small businesses involved in construction, repair, or maintenance of school buildings.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal would allow the governing body of any school to exempt the school from the state prevailing wage law by majority vote.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
