FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials with **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assumed they could be required to make changes to forms that are supplied to Missouri courts who issue the notice of suspension. In addition, the Driver and Vehicle Services Bureau will be required to make modifications to training resources that are sent to courts regarding this process. These changes can be made using existing resources. DOR further assumes there could be program changes to incorporate the automatic suspensions.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

This bill requires the Director of the Department of Revenue to return noncommercial drivers' licenses and remove suspensions from driving records when licensees provide proof of the disposition of charges and payment of all applicable fines and court costs. In cases involving commercial drivers' licenses, the director will reinstate licenses upon receiving proof of the disposition of charges and payment of all applicable fines and court costs.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
