## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This bill authorizes landlords to remove and dispose of tenants' property left in rented premises after the tenants fail to vacate the premises in accordance with a court order issued pursuant to Sections 441.710 - 441.880, RSMo (expedited eviction proceedings). The bill also authorizes cities and villages to restrict, by order or ordinance, when and where landlords may remove tenants' property.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
