FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education** (DHE) assume this legislation has no direct fiscal impact on the DHE. However, it would have an impact on the higher education institution specified due to costs incurred with the change in institutional mission to a statewide mission. Further, unknown costs are likely for the included institution as the proposal allows the institution to seek state funding for master's degree programs. Costs would also be incurred by the institution for changes in signage, stationary, and other related changes.

Although officials from **Missouri Western State College** did not respond to our request for information, in response to a similar proposal in the previous session, they assumed this proposal would have no impact on their organization. They stated that with proper planning, the change could be done at minimal cost and would not result in the need for additional state appropriations.

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ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight assumes this proposal would result in minimal one-time costs to Missouri Western State College for signage, stationary, and other related changes. Oversight further assumes there would be no permanent increase in operating costs as a result of this proposal, and that any costs associated with prospective changes in institutional mission would be addressed through the normal state budget process for higher education.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would change the name of Missouri Western State College to Missouri Western State University. The proposal also changes the mission of that institution to statewide, authorizes graduate programs, and eliminates nondegree programs, all subject to approval by the Coordinating Board for Higher Education.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
