#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials of the **Department of Natural Resources** stated this proposal requires the Director of the Department of Natural Resources to appoint a nine member board of trustees for the watershed improvement district. Officials assume no fiscal impact.

Officials of the **Department of Conservation** assume they would have minimal fiscal impact. Officials stated the "exact amount of impact is unknown".

**Oversight** assumes this is a local district and would have no state fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes this proposal has no funding mechanism, therefore, Oversight assumes this proposal only authorizes the creation of a Watershed Improvement District at the discretion of the County Commissions of member counties. Oversight assumes no local fiscal impact. Oversight assumes if this proposal would have a funding mechanism then there would be income to the district from whatever source, and there would be cost of operation of the district, all of which would offset resulting in an annual zero fiscal impact, or a positive fund balance.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### DESCRIPTION

This bill creates the Upper White River Basin Watershed Improvement District, an area that includes Table Rock Lake, the James River, the White River, Lake Taneycomo, and Bull Shoals Lake. The district is authorized to own, install, operate, and maintain decentralized or individual on-site wastewater treatment plants.

The county commission of any county located within the district can authorize individual properties to be served by the district by adopting a resolution. Before the resolution can be adopted, a petition signed by at least 60% of the property owners within the proposed area must be filed with the commission.

Property that is currently served by a sewer district cannot be a part of the watershed improvement district unless the existing sewer district agrees to stop providing service to the property. The watershed improvement district will not provide service to any property unless the owner wants the service. Property owners who participate in the district must provide proof of creditworthiness. Sewer systems installed on property that participates in the district must meet the standards set by the district board and the appropriate state agencies.

Participating property owners must have a maintenance plan approved by the district for the sewer systems on their property, and they must execute a utilities easement to allow the district access to the system for maintenance and inspection.

# **DESCRIPTION** continued

The watershed improvement district will have a board of trustees. The board will have nine members, each from a different county, appointed by the Department of Natural Resources. The bill specifies the length of term each trustee will serve and the manner in which successive trustees will be chosen.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
