### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal would make it unlawful for an employer to deduct from an employee's wages the value of any merchandise stolen from the employer.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
