FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials with the **Department of Public Safety and Department of Transportation** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials with the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume their agency would be required to notify their field offices of the procedural changes contained in this act. DOR estimates a total cost in FY05 totaling \$530 for printing, envelopes, and postage related to this notification.

Oversight assumes that such notification could take place within the normal parameters of field communication and that the additional notification warranted by this proposal can be done utilizing existing resources already in place or planned.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


DESCRIPTION

This legislation stipulates that beginning January 1, 2005, the Director of Revenue shall not authorize the manufacture of the material to produce a particular type of specialized license plates until the Director has received 400 applications for such a type of plates.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
