### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials of the **Department of Economic Development - Public Service Commission (PSC)** state this proposal would require the PSC to receive registrations of individuals or entities that obtain certain ownership in utilities regulated by the PSC and provides a certain amount of specific commodities to corporations regulated by the PSC. PSC is not requesting additional resources due to this proposal.

Officials of the **Department of Economic Development - Office of the Public Counsel (OPC)** state although this bill has some impact on OPC, OPC should be able to absorb the changes; however, if the requirements of this bill are combined with additional requirements or changes OPC may incur a fiscal impact.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal requires any person or entity that has a legal or equitable interest of 5% or more in both a public utility and any corporation that supplies products or services worth \$1 million annually to that public utility to give written notice to the Missouri Public Service Commission within 30 days of acquiring an interest. Violation of the bill is a class A misdemeanor.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
