FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Corrections, Department of Public Safety** – **Missouri State Highway Patrol** and the **Office of State Public Defender** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** assume the proposal may result in the Attorney General's Office promulgating rules to implement the legislation. These rules would be published in the Missouri Register and the Code of State Regulations. These rules could require as many as 6 pages in the Code of State Regulations and half again as many pages in the Missouri Register, as cost statements, fiscal notes, and the like are not repeated in the Code. The estimated cost of a page in the Missouri Register is \$23 and the estimated cost of a page in the Code of State Regulations is \$27. Based on these costs, the estimated cost of the proposal is \$369 in FY 05 and unknown in subsequent years. The actual cost could be more or less than the numbers given. The impact of this legislation in future years is unknown and depends upon the frequency and length of rules filed, amended, rescinded, or withdrawn.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which would require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** and the **Office of Prosecution Services** did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small businesses who use unsolicited fax transmissions could experience a fiscal impact as a result of this legislation.

DESCRIPTION

Beginning January 1, 2005, the proposed legislation would prohibit unsolicited fax transmissions to a residential subscriber who has requested that their number be placed on the no-call list.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
