FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials with the **Department of Transportation**, **Department of Public Safety**, and the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials with the **Department of Revenue** (DOR) anticipate that this legislation will require changes for the Over the Counter driver license issuance system and supporting systems, such as the Missouri Driver License system, the Central Driver License Information System, and the Missouri Taxation and Accounting System. For FY05, DOR anticipates needing 40 hours of contracted programming to edit their systems at the rate of \$100 per hour.

DOR also expects to need to test the program changes, requiring 320 hours of overtime compensation at the rate of \$23 per hour.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This act permits an intermediate driver's license to remain valid for the five business days immediately following the expiration date if such date occurs on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. This act also allows the director of revenue to promulgate any rules necessary to facilitate the early renewal of an intermediate driver's license, no more than seven days prior to the applicant's eighteenth birthday.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
