## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### DESCRIPTION

This proposal would create a new tort action for damages for emergency personnel. Firefighters, peace officers, and emergency medical personnel would be allowed to seek recovery from any person whose reckless, malicious, or willful act or omission caused injury or death to emergency personnel. Emergency personnel would not be permitted to seek recovery from their employer or from other emergency personnel.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
