FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety, Missouri Veterans Commission**, (VETS) assume there were approximately 419,000 Wartime Veterans in Missouri as or September 30, 2003. VETS officials assume the proposal would have no direct impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety, Office of the Adjutant General**, and the **Office of Administration, Division of Budget and Planning**, assume this proposal would have no impact on their organizations.

ASSUMPTIONS (continued)

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Conservation** (MDC) assume this proposal would reduce revenues from hunting and fishing license sales by at least \$2,152,000 per year. MDC estimated the losses by using the Division of Veterans Affairs estimate of wartime veterans living in Missouri and deducted those over 65, who would already be eligible for free hunting and fishing licenses. MDC assumed this proposal would provide free to these qualified wartime veterans the lifetime hunting and fishing license which MDC could have otherwise sold to these veterans. MDC assumes a full year of lost revenue for FY 2005, since the proposal would become effective at a time in the license cycle when recipients of the free licenses would receive most of the benefits of the license. The MDC lifetime hunting and fishing license includes the trout and migratory bird season licenses but does not include deer and turkey season licenses, which are sold separately. If the intent of the proposal was to include free deer and turkey season licenses as well as the current lifetime license program, the lost license revenue would be significantly larger.

In addition, MDC stated that the lost license revenue could result in the loss of federal reimbursements from the federal wildlife and sport fishing restoration cost sharing programs. MDC stated the cost sharing program revenue losses have not been determined but could exceed the lost license revenue.

Oversight assumes this proposal would result in a reduction in revenues to the Conservation Commission Fund greater than \$2,152,000 each year, beginning in FY 2005.

This proposal would reduce Total State Revenue.
