#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

In response to almost identical legislation the following fiscal impact statements were made:

Officials of the **Department of Natural Resources**, **Department of Transportation**, and **Department of Conservation** assume no fiscal impact.

In response to similar legislation, Officials of the **Office of St. Louis County Administrator** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact other than to assist St. Louis County in developing infrastructure in the Chesterfield Valley area. Officials assume there would be no additional revenues.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal is enabling legislation and is procedural and would add no new duties, or requires any additional expenditure of revenues, therefore, Oversight assumes no fiscal impact to levee districts.

Due to timing requirements not all Cities and Counties responded to this proposal.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### DESCRIPTION

This act allows the formation of a levee district in any city, town, or village that is not located in St. Charles County. However, there is a provision which allows third and fourth class cities in St. Charles County to form levee districts. Under current law, levee districts can be formed in one or more counties, in a third or fourth class city, and in certain other cities.

The act allows certain levee districts in St. Louis County to construct and maintain waterlines, in addition to their current authority to construct and maintain sewers, levees, dikes, dams, and other similar projects.

The act modifies the procedure concerning apportionment of installment taxes for all levee districts.

This act provides that modifications made by the General Assembly to Section 245.015, RSMo, concerning levee districts, shall not be construed to enhance or limit the current law with regard to where a levee district may be formed within St. Charles County or any city, town, or village within the county.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
