FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Transportation** stated that due to federal law preemption, this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency or on small business

Officials from the **City of Pacific** anticipated that this proposal would require them to construct a passenger platform in FY05, at an approximate cost of \$20,000. Costs for the city in both FY06 and FY07 would consist of \$2,500 each year for maintenance of a commuter lot area where the platform would be constructed and \$5,000 each year for advertising. Under this proposal, the city anticipates increased revenues to due to visitors to the downtown area of \$3,000 in FY05, \$10,000 in FY06, and \$15,000 in FY07.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Oversight assumes that small retailers in the proximity of a new passenger railroad station in Pacific would benefit from increased traffic in the area. The extent of such benefit is not known.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would require every railroad corporation owning or operating a railroad that travels through Pacific, MO, to establish a suitable stopping facility there to load and unload passengers.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
