FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Governor** and the **Office of Administration** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

In response to a similar proposal from this year, officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** assumed that any potential costs from this proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri National Guard (MNG)** state the current armory is in poor condition and not adequate for military usage. By closing this armory, the State of Missouri will avoid significant cost to repair and renovate the existing armory. The MNG assumes no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials from Pierce City did not respond to our request for fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes the state will be disposing of the National Guard Armory in Pierce City from its general fixed assets for \$1, which is immaterial for purposes of the fiscal note.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal authorizes the Governor to convey certain state property located in Lawrence County known as the National Guard Armory Building to the City of Pierce City. Upon conveyance, the building will be known as the Ray A. Carver Building.

The proposal has an emergency clause.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
