#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This bill revises provisions pertaining to the Board of Trustees of the St. Louis Police Retirement System and certain retirement benefits. Six trustees of the board will constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and official actions of the board will require a majority vote of the trustees present. Currently, six votes of the trustees are necessary for official actions.

Effective September 2, 2004, the bill also specifies that a court of competent jurisdiction can divide pension benefits between parties to any action for the dissolution of marriage.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
