ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **House of Representatives** and the **Senate** stated that the proposal would not directly affect their agencies.

Secretary of State officials stated that advertisement costs for the proposal would be \$3,684 per column inch for three printings of the text of the proposal, the introduction, fiscal note summary, and affidavit. The proposal would be on the ballot for the November 2004 general election.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would reduce the minimum age for state representatives from twenty-four (24) years of age to twenty-one (21) years of ages. It would reduce the minimum age for state senators from thirty (30) years of age to twenty-five (25) years of age.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space. This proposal would not affect Total State Revenue.
