FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **Department of Health and Senior Services** assume no fiscal impact.

Officials of the **Department of Economic Development - Public Service Commission and Public Counsel**, assume no fiscal impact.

In response to almost identical legislation of the 2002 session, the **Department of Revenue - Sales Tax Division**, assumed no fiscal impact.

The **Jasper County Commission** assumes the imposition of the tax would help counties to pay for emergency operations.

Oversight assumes this is enabling legislation and would have no fiscal impact, unless the provisions of this proposal would be enacted by the County Commission with voter approval. As written this proposal does not require locals to place the issue of a sales tax for emergency services before the voter, therefore, Oversight will show fiscal impact to local government as \$0.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This bill allows counties that already have established emergency telephone service 911 boards pursuant to Section 190.309, RSMo, to impose a county sales tax for emergency services without establishing an emergency services board pursuant to Section 190.335. The bill contains an emergency clause.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
