DESCRIPTION


In 2002, voters approved a constitutional amendment allowing joint municipal utility commissions to develop utility projects with municipalities, electric cooperatives, or public utilities without additional regulation by the Missouri Public Service Commission. This substitute updates the Missouri Revised Statutes to reflect these changes.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
