FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

Beginning January 1, 2005, state employees may donate a portion of their accrued annual leave directly to a specific state employee. The donation may be instead of or in addition to a donation into the established pool. All current requirements for the program apply to donations made to a specific state employee or the pool.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
