## FISCAL ANALYSIS

### ASSUMPTIONS

Officials from the **Department of Conservation**, the **Department of Transportation**; the **Office of Administration, Division of Design and Construction**; and the **University of Missouri** assume this proposal would have no impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Office of Administration, Division of Purchasing and Materials Management**, (OADC) assume their organization would be required to develop bid language incorporating the required language. OADC stated they were unable to estimate the cost of these changes.

**Oversight** assumes the costs would be minimal and could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development** and the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** did not respond to our request for information.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would require bidders on certain construction projects to certify that they are paying employees subject to a prevailing wage requirement the specified prevailing wage, and would prohibit bidders on those projects from receiving any form of wage subsidy for the project.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
