FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal would impact small businesses involved in construction.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would require bidders on certain construction projects to certify that they are paying employees subject to a prevailing wage requirement the specified prevailing wage, and would prohibit bidders on those projects from receiving any form of wage subsidy for the project.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
