FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration** and the **Department of Mental Health** assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services-Division of Medical Services (DMS)** assume this proposal requires Medicaid reimbursement rates to be increased by 2 percent/year for the next five years.

The fee-for-service (FFS) expenditures paid to physicians, clinics and nurse practitioners for the first six months of FY 04 were annualized and increased by 4.5% to arrive at the estimated FY 05 physician expenditures of \$184,126,118. The FY 05 projection was multiplied by 2% to arrive at the impact on FFS of \$3,682,522. The \$3.7 million was added to the FY 05 projection to arrive at the FY 06 base. The base was then increased by 4.5% to arrive at the estimated FY 06 expenditures. The FY 06 expenditures were multiplied by 2% to arrive at the impact on FFS of \$3,925,201. The methodology was repeated to arrive at the FFS impact for FY 07 of \$4,183,871.

A 4.5% inflation adjustment was made to account for an increase in utilization and caseload growth. The 4.5% is the standard fiscal note inflation rate for medical care.

Medicaid services are provided through the FFS program and a managed care program. Rates for services provided by the managed care program would also be increased by 2%. FFS eligibles make up 54.5% of total eligibles and eligibles enrolled in managed care make up the remaining 45.5%. The FY 05 total cost \$6,756,921 of increasing physician rates 2% was found by dividing the FFS impact of \$3,682,522 by 54.5% (FFS share).

Oversight assumes the rate increases are cumulative, therefore the fiscal impact to General Revenue will be \$2,625,064 in FY05, \$5,423,120 in FY06, and \$8,405,568 in FY 07.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume that the increase in reimbursement rate will result in an increased number of appeals from physician providers. Based upon information provided to the AGO by the DOS, AGO assumes that because it will be defending the DOS in its reimbursement rates, AGO will need 7 additional Assistant Attorney Generals and 3 Legal Secretaries at a cost of \$344,221 in FY05, \$423,391 in FY06, and \$433,976 in FY07.

Oversight assumes AGO will not need additional FTE since this proposal does not provide for appeals.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

Beginning in Fiscal Year 2005, this proposal requires the Medicaid reimbursement rate for participating physicians to increase 2% each year for the next five years.

The bill contains an emergency clause.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
