### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This bill requires the Office of Administration to apply certification procedures for minority business enterprises and women's business enterprises from other states that are as restrictive as the procedures used in the enterprise's home state. If the other state's procedures include restrictive requirements such as residency, Missouri's certification procedures must be reciprocal with the requirements of the other state.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
