FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials with the **Department of Transportation** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials with the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume this proposal requires all existing specialty plate applications excluding military specialty plates to cost \$25, up from the current rate of \$15. Currently there are approximately 160,530 specialty and personalized plates on the General Registration System (GRS). After deducting the 10,259 military plates from the total and considering that approximately 50% of applicants choose biennial registration, the anticipated additional revenue is as follows:

37,568 plates issued * \$10 fee increase \$375,680

75,136 plates issued * \$10 fee increase \$751,360

FY 07 Income

75,136 plates issued * \$10 fee increase \$751,360

DESCRIPTION

This legislation initiates a review process and regulations for establishing new specialty license plates, raises specialty plate fees to \$25, and eliminates the six-letter restriction on personalized plates.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
