### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Department of Corrections** and **Missouri Department of Conservation** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation (DOT)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on the MHTC/DOT or Highway & Patrol Medical Plan.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DOS)** state the proposal sets a new sunset date for January 1, 2011. The Division of Family Services assumes the proposal will have no fiscal impact on the DOS.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** state the proposal will have no fiscal impact on the DMH. The proposal relates to the health insurance coverage of "Mental Health and Chemical Dependency". Section 376.827.2, RSMo, requires a health insurer, if offering mental illness and chemical dependency coverage, to not place a greater financial burden on an insured for access and treatment than is imposed for physical conditions. The proposal does not require coverage of mental illness

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#### ASSUMPTION (continued)

**Oversight** assumes if the Mental Health and Chemical Dependency Insurance Act is extended to January 1, 2011, the result will be potential forgone savings to General Revenue, Other State Funds, and Local Government Funds. **Oversight** assumes forgone savings for General Revenue and Other State Funds of approximately \$1,523,370 to \$1,741,915 for FY 05 (six months); \$3,138,141 to \$3,5,88,345 for FY 06; and \$3,232,285 to \$3,695,995 for FY 07. **Oversight** also assumes forgone savings to Local Government Funds of between \$0 and \$407,195 for FY 05; \$0 to \$838,821 for FY 06; and \$0 to \$863,986 for FY 07 These estimates were determined using the fiscal note impact for HCS for SS for SCS for SB 338 (1999) and applying a 3% growth factor.
