AN ACT

To appropriate money for the expenses, grants, and distributions of the Department of Social Services and the several divisions and programs thereof to be expended only as provided in Article IV, Section 28 of the Constitution of Missouri, for the period beginning July 1, 2004 and ending June 30, 2005.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

The funds appropriated in this act shall only be used to fund the designated purposes
2 provided herein, and shall not be used, transferred, exchanged, or offset in any way to fund other
3 purposes, including but not limited to, all purposes enumerated by any other appropriation bill
4 approved by the 92nd General Assembly, Second Regular Session, except with the express written
5 consent of the chairman and ranking member of the House Budget Committee and the chair and
6 ranking member of the Senate Appropriations Committee and subsequent approval of any such
7 changes by Concurrent Resolution by the next regular session of the General Assembly. There
8 is appropriated out of the State Treasury, to be expended only as provided in Article IV, Section
9 28 of the Constitution of Missouri, for the purpose of funding each department, division, agency,
10 and program enumerated in each section for the item or items stated, and for no other purpose
11 whatsoever chargeable to the fund designated for the period beginning July 1, 2004 and ending
12 June 30, 2005 as follows:
