**AN ACT**

To appropriate money for supplemental purposes for the several departments and offices of state government, and for the payment of various claims for refunds, for persons, firms, and corporations, and for other purposes, and to transfer money among certain funds, from the funds designated for the fiscal period ending June 30, 2004.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

 23 option they choose. This language does not create any entitlements  
 24 not established by statute. The single state agency administering  
 25 the Medicaid program is only authorized to reimburse for benefits  
 26 that exceed a recipient's spend down amount. Monies are not  
 27 appropriated for coverage of medical assistance for persons whose  
 28 incomes, calculated using less restrictive income methodologies, as  
 29 authorized in 42 USC Section 1396(r)(2), exceeds ninety percent of  
 30 the federal poverty level, and those persons whose income exceeds  
 31 ninety percent of the federal poverty level will not be eligible for  
 32 old age assistance benefits, permanent and total disability benefits,
