## House Concurrent Resolution No. 19

## 92<sup>ND</sup> GENERAL ASSEMBLY

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	Whereas, service learning promotes skills that are needed in a twenty-first century
2	economy, such as collaboration, problem-solving, and critical thinking; and
4	Whereas, the Missouri Assessment Program requires students to be able to think
5 6 7	critically to solve real-world problems, which can be a challenge to present in a typical classroom setting; and
8	Whereas, students who engage in service learning show a stronger attachment to
9 10 11	their communities, thereby strengthening the economic base, especially in rural areas that tend to lose their young people upon graduation; and
12	Whereas, service learning demonstrates particular effectiveness with special
13 14 15	education and alternative school students, giving such students a chance to succeed in and beyond the classroom; and
16	Whereas, service learning supports character-building, and both the State of
17 18	Missouri and the Federal Government promote character education; and
19	Whereas, the President of the United States has called upon all Americans to serve
20 21	their country by giving 4,000 hours of service over a lifetime; and
22	Whereas, school districts sometimes are concerned that service learning is not
23	explicitly permitted as a means of earning credit towards graduation, and having explicit

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permission and guidance would provide a measure of assurance for them; and 25 Whereas, Iowa and other states have adopted service-learning measures. More 26 than 60% of all public schools arrange or require community service, with the percentage of high 27 schools rising to more than 80%; and 28 29 Whereas, service learning is not isolated instances of volunteerism, but is instead 30 a coordinated effort to link academic curricula and learning objectives with community service: 31 32 Now, therefore, be it resolved that the members of the House of 33 34 Representatives of the Ninety-second General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby urge the State Board of Education to encourage the adoption of 35 service-learning programs and projects among school districts to foster academic achievement, 36 37 civic engagement, and character development; and 38 Be it further resolved that the members of the General Assembly encourage 39 the State Board of Education to provide technical assistance to school districts that implement 40 41 service learning programs and projects in locating, leveraging, and utilizing alternative financial resources that will assist teachers desiring to receive training in developing and administering 42 service learning programs or projects; and 43 44 Be it further resolved that the member of the General Assembly encourage 45 46 local boards of education that maintain high schools to include service-learning as part of any 47 course contributing to the satisfaction of credits necessary for high school graduation and to use 48 service-learning as an instructional strategy at any grade level to address appropriate areas of 49 current state educational standards for student knowledge and performance; and 50 Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of 51 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the State 52

Board of Education and the Commissioner of Education.
