AN ACT

To repeal sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 51.281, 52.269, 53.082, 54.261, 54.320, 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, 58.095, and 473.742, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof fourteen new sections relating to maximum allowable compensation for certain county officials.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 51.281, 52.269, 53.082, 54.261, 54.320, 2 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, 58.095, and 473.742, RSMo, are repealed and fourteen new sections 3 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 51.281, 51.283, 52.269, 53.082, 54.261, 54.320, 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, 58.095, and 473.742, to read as follows: 4 49.082. 1. A county commissioner in any county, other than in a first classification chartered county or a first classification county not having a charter form of government and not 2 3 containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, shall, subject to any other adjustment otherwise provided in this section, receive an annual salary computed 4 as set forth in the following schedule. The assessed valuation factor shall be the amount thereof 5 as shown for the year next preceding the computation. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to a 32 commissioner only if the commissioner has completed at least twenty hours of classroom 33 instruction each calendar year relating to the operations of the commissioner's office when approved by a professional association of the county commissioners of Missouri unless exempted 34 from the training by the professional association. The professional association approving the 35 program shall provide a certificate of completion to each commissioner who completes the 36 37 training program and shall send a list of certified commissioners to the treasurer of each county. 38 Expenses incurred for attending the training session [may] shall be reimbursed to a county 39 commissioner in the same manner as other expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose. 40 4. A county commissioner in any county, other than a first classification charter county

40 4. A county commissioner in any county, other than a first classification clarter county 41 or a first classification county not having a charter form of government and not containing any 42 part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, shall not, except upon a 43 two-thirds vote of all the members of the salary commission, receive an annual compensation 44 in an amount less than the total compensation being received for the office of county 45 commissioner or presiding commissioner respectively for the particular county for services 46 rendered or performed on the date the salary commission votes.

50.334. 1. In all counties, except counties of the first classification having a charter form

2 of government and counties of the first classification not having a charter form of government 3 and not containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, each 4 recorder of deeds, if the recorder's office is separate from that of the circuit clerk, shall receive as total compensation for all services performed by the recorder, except as provided pursuant to 5 section 50.333, an annual salary which shall be computed on an assessed valuation basis, 6 without regard to modifications due to the existence of enterprise zones or financing under 7 chapter 100, RSMo, as set forth in the following schedule. The assessed valuation factor shall 8 9 be the amount thereof as computed for the year next preceding the computation. The county 10 recorder of deeds whose office is separate from that of the circuit clerk in any county, other than 11 a county of the first classification having a charter form of government or a county of the first 12 classification not having a charter form of government and not containing any part of a city with 13 a population of three hundred thousand or more, shall not, except upon two-thirds vote of all the 14 members of the salary commission, receive an annual compensation in an amount less than the 15 total compensation being received for the office of county recorder of deeds in the particular 16 county for services rendered or performed on January 1, [1997] 2004.

2. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to the recorder only if he has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each calendar

year relating to the operations of the recorder's office when approved by a professional association of the county recorders of deeds of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the professional association. The professional association approving the program shall provide a certificate of completion to each recorder who completes the training program and shall send a list of certified recorders to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for attending the training session shall be reimbursed to the county recorder in the same manner as other expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

50.343. 1. Other provisions of law to the contrary notwithstanding, in any first 2 classification nonchartered county, including any county containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, the annual salary of a county recorder of deeds, 3 4 clerk, auditor, county commissioner, collector, treasurer, assessor or salaried public administrator may be computed on an assessed valuation basis, without regard to modifications due to the 5 existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100, RSMo, as set forth in the 6 7 following schedule except as provided in [subsection 2] subsections 2 and 3 of this section. The assessed valuation factor shall be the amount thereof as shown for the year next preceding the 8 computation. The provisions of this section shall not permit a reduction in the amount of 9 compensation being paid on January 1, [1997] 2004, for any of the offices subject to this section 10 11 on January 1, [1997] 2004.

After December 31, 1990, in any county of the second classification which becomes 37 a first classification county without a charter form of government, the annual compensation of 38 county recorder of deeds, clerk, auditor, county commissioner, collector, treasurer, assessor and 39 the public administrator in counties where the public administrator is paid a salary under the 40 provisions of section 473.740, RSMo, may be set at the option of the salary commission. On or 41 before October first of the year immediately prior to the beginning of the county fiscal year 42 following the general election after the certification by the state equalizing agency that the county 43 possesses an assessed valuation placing it in first classification status, the salary commission 44 shall meet for the purpose of setting compensation for such county offices or officials and such 45 compensation shall be payable immediately except that no compensation of any county office 46 or county official shall be reduced and the compensation of presiding county commissioners in 47 any of such counties shall be two thousand dollars more than the compensation paid to the 48 associate commissioners in that county. Thereafter in all such counties the salary commission 49 shall meet for the purpose of setting the compensation of the offices or officers in this subsection 50 who will be elected at the next general election, and such compensation shall be payable upon 51 the beginning of the next term of office of such offices or officers; except that, no compensation 52 of any office or officer shall be reduced and the compensation of presiding county 53 commissioners in any of such counties shall be two thousand dollars more than the compensation 54 paid to the associate commissioners in that county. Two thousand dollars of the compensation established under the procedures authorized pursuant to this subsection shall be payable to a 55 56 county officer only if the officer has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction in 57 the operation of the office in the same manner as provided by law for the offices and officers 58 subject to the provisions of section 50.333. At the salary commission meeting which establishes 59 the percentage rate to be applied to the county offices or officers during the next term of office, 60 the salary commission may authorize the further adjustment of such officers' compensation as 61 a cost-of-living component and effective January first of each year, the compensation for county offices or officers may be adjusted by the county commission, not to exceed the percentage 62 63 increase given to the other county employees.

 majority of the county salary commission members, the salary of associate commissioners of a

52.269. 1. In all counties, except first classification counties having a charter form of 2 government and first classification counties not having a charter form of government and not containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, the county 3 4 collector shall receive an annual salary which shall be paid in equal monthly installments by the 5 county. The professional association approving the program shall provide a 43 certificate of completion to each collector who completes the training program and shall send 44 a list of certified collectors to the treasurer of each county. The compensation for county assessors in second, third and fourth classification 29 counties for the term of office beginning September 1, [1997] **2005**, shall be calculated pursuant 30 to the salary schedule in this section using the percentage increase approved by the county salary 31 commission when establishing the compensation for the office of county assessor at the salary 32 commission meeting in [1997] **2005**. This salary shall become effective on September 1, [1997] 33 **2005**.

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3. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to the

45 compensation in an amount less than the total compensation being received for the office of
46 county assessor in the particular county for services rendered or performed on the date the salary
47 commission votes.

54.261. 1. The county treasurer in counties of the first classification, not having a charter form of government and containing a portion of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, and in counties of the second, third and fourth classifications of this state, shall receive as compensation for services performed by the treasurer an annual salary based upon the assessed valuation of the county. The provisions of this section shall not permit or require a reduction[, nor shall require an increase,] in the amount of compensation being paid for the office of treasurer on January 1, [2002] **2004**.

Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to the 30 treasurer only if the treasurer has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each 31 calendar year relating to the operations of the treasurer's office when approved by a professional 32 association of the county treasurers or county collectors of Missouri unless exempted from the 33 training by the professional association. The professional association approving the program 34 shall provide a certificate of completion to each treasurer who completes the training program 35 and shall send a list of certified treasurers to the county commission of each county. Expenses 36 incurred for attending the training session [may] shall be reimbursed to the county treasurer in 37 the same manner as other expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

4. The county treasurer in any county, other than a county of the first classification having a charter form of government or a county of the first classification not having a charter form of government and not containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, shall not, except upon two-thirds vote of all the members of the commission, receive an annual compensation in an amount less than the total compensation being received for the office of county treasurer in the particular county for services rendered or performed on the date the salary commission votes.

In the event of a vacancy in the office of treasurer in any county except a county of the first classification with a charter form of government, when there is no deputy treasurer, the county commission shall appoint a qualified acting treasurer until such time as the vacancy is filled by the governor pursuant to section 105.030, RSMo.
