**AN ACT**

To repeal sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 51.281, 52.269, 53.082, 54.261, 54.320, 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, 58.095, and 473.742, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof fourteen new sections relating to maximum allowable compensation for certain county officials.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 51.281, 52.269, 53.082, 54.261, 54.320, 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, 58.095, and 473.742, RSMo, are repealed and fourteen new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 51.281, 51.283, 52.269, 53.082, 54.261, 54.320, 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, 58.095, and 473.742, to read as follows:

49.082. 1. A county commissioner in any county, other than in a first classification chartered county or a first classification county not having a charter form of government and not containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, shall, subject to any other adjustment otherwise provided in this section, receive an annual salary computed as set forth in the following schedule. The assessed valuation factor shall be the amount thereof as shown for the year next preceding the computation. The provisions of this section shall not permit or require a reduction in the amount of compensation being paid for the office of commissioner on January 1, [1997] **2004**.

28           2. In addition to any compensation provided pursuant to subsection 1 of this section, the  
 29 presiding commissioner of any county not having a charter form of government shall receive two  
 30 thousand dollars annual salary.

31           3. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to a  
 32 commissioner only if the commissioner has completed at least twenty hours of classroom  
 33 instruction each calendar year relating to the operations of the commissioner's office when  
 34 approved by a professional association of the county commissioners of Missouri unless exempted  
 35 from the training by the professional association. The professional association approving the  
 36 program shall provide a certificate of completion to each commissioner who completes the  
 37 training program and shall send a list of certified commissioners to the treasurer of each county.  
 38 Expenses incurred for attending the training session [may] **shall** be reimbursed to a county  
 39 commissioner in the same manner as other expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

40           4. A county commissioner in any county, other than a first classification charter county  
 41 or a first classification county not having a charter form of government and not containing any  
 42 part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, shall not, except upon a  
 43 two-thirds vote of all the members of the salary commission, receive an annual compensation  
 44 in an amount less than the total compensation being received for the office of county  
 45 commissioner or presiding commissioner respectively for the particular county for services  
 46 rendered or performed on the date the salary commission votes.

50.334. 1. In all counties, except counties of the first classification having a charter form

2 of government and counties of the first classification not having a charter form of government  
 3 and not containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, each  
 4 recorder of deeds, if the recorder's office is separate from that of the circuit clerk, shall receive  
 5 as total compensation for all services performed by the recorder, except as provided pursuant to  
 6 section 50.333, an annual salary which shall be computed on an assessed valuation basis,  
 7 **without regard to modifications due to the existence of enterprise zones or financing under**  
 8 **chapter 100, RSMo,** as set forth in the following schedule. The assessed valuation factor shall  
 9 be the amount thereof as computed for the year next preceding the computation. The county  
 10 recorder of deeds whose office is separate from that of the circuit clerk in any county, other than  
 11 a county of the first classification having a charter form of government or a county of the first  
 12 classification not having a charter form of government and not containing any part of a city with  
 13 a population of three hundred thousand or more, shall not, except upon two-thirds vote of all the  
 14 members of the salary commission, receive an annual compensation in an amount less than the  
 15 total compensation being received for the office of county recorder of deeds in the particular  
 16 county for services rendered or performed on January 1, [1997] **2004.**

36 2. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to the  
 37 recorder only if he has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each calendar

38 year relating to the operations of the recorder's office when approved by a professional  
 39 association of the county recorders of deeds of Missouri unless exempted from the training by  
 40 the professional association. The professional association approving the program shall provide  
 41 a certificate of completion to each recorder who completes the training program and shall send  
 42 a list of certified recorders to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for attending the  
 43 training session shall be reimbursed to the county recorder in the same manner as other expenses  
 44 as may be appropriated for that purpose.

50.343. 1. Other provisions of law to the contrary notwithstanding, in any first  
 2 classification nonchartered county, including any county containing any part of a city with a  
 3 population of three hundred thousand or more, the annual salary of a county recorder of deeds,  
 4 clerk, auditor, county commissioner, collector, treasurer, assessor or salaried public administrator  
 5 may be computed on an assessed valuation basis, **without regard to modifications due to the**  
 6 **existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100, RSMo**, as set forth in the  
 7 following schedule except as provided in [subsection 2] **subsections 2 and 3** of this section. The  
 8 assessed valuation factor shall be the amount thereof as shown for the year next preceding the  
 9 computation. The provisions of this section shall not permit a reduction in the amount of  
 10 compensation being paid on January 1, [1997] **2004**, for any of the offices subject to this section  
 11 on January 1, [1997] **2004**.

34 (2) Presiding commissioners shall receive a salary of two thousand dollars more than the  
 35 salary received by the associate commissioners.

36 2. After December 31, 1990, in any county of the second classification which becomes  
 37 a first classification county without a charter form of government, the annual compensation of  
 38 county recorder of deeds, clerk, auditor, county commissioner, collector, treasurer, assessor and  
 39 the public administrator in counties where the public administrator is paid a salary under the  
 40 provisions of section 473.740, RSMo, may be set at the option of the salary commission. On or  
 41 before October first of the year immediately prior to the beginning of the county fiscal year  
 42 following the general election after the certification by the state equalizing agency that the county  
 43 possesses an assessed valuation placing it in first classification status, the salary commission  
 44 shall meet for the purpose of setting compensation for such county **offices or** officials and such  
 45 compensation shall be payable immediately except that no compensation of any **county office**  
 46 **or** county official shall be reduced and the compensation of presiding county commissioners in  
 47 any of such counties shall be two thousand dollars more than the compensation paid to the  
 48 associate commissioners in that county. Thereafter in all such counties the salary commission  
 49 shall meet for the purpose of setting the compensation of the **offices or** officers in this subsection  
 50 who will be elected at the next general election, and such compensation shall be payable upon  
 51 the beginning of the next term of office of such **offices or** officers; except that, no compensation  
 52 of any **office or** officer shall be reduced and the compensation of presiding county  
 53 commissioners in any of such counties shall be two thousand dollars more than the compensation  
 54 paid to the associate commissioners in that county. Two thousand dollars of the compensation  
 55 established under the procedures authorized pursuant to this subsection shall be payable to a  
 56 county officer only if the officer has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction in  
 57 the operation of the office in the same manner as provided by law for **the offices and** officers  
 58 subject to the provisions of section 50.333. At the salary commission meeting which establishes  
 59 the percentage rate to be applied to **the county offices or** officers during the next term of office,  
 60 the salary commission may authorize the further adjustment of such officers' compensation as  
 61 a cost-of-living component and effective January first of each year, the compensation for county  
 62 **offices or** officers may be adjusted by the county commission, not to exceed the percentage  
 63 increase given to the other county employees.

64 3. [Other provisions of this section to the contrary notwithstanding, at the option of a  
 65 majority of the county salary commission members, the salary of associate commissioners of a

66 county of the first classification without a charter form of government with a population of at  
 67 least eighty-two thousand but not more than eighty-five thousand inhabitants may be set at no  
 68 more than sixty-five percent of the amount on the salary schedule for the county affected] **The**  
 69 **compensation for county assessors in counties of the first classification for the term of**  
 70 **office beginning September 1, 2005, shall be calculated under the salary schedule in this**  
 71 **section using the percentage increase approved by the county salary commission when**  
 72 **establishing the compensation for the office of county assessor at the salary commission**  
 73 **meeting in 2005. This salary shall become effective September 1, 2005.**

51.281. 1. The county clerk in any county, other than in a first classification county,  
 2 shall receive an annual salary computed as set forth in the following schedule. **The salary shall**  
 3 **be computed on an assessed valuation basis, without regard to modifications due to the**  
 4 **existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100, RSMo, as provided in this**  
 5 **subsection.** The assessed valuation factor shall be the amount thereof as shown for the year next  
 6 preceding the computation. The provisions of this section shall not permit or require a reduction  
 7 in the amount of compensation being paid for the office of clerk on January 1, [1997] **2004.**

27 2. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to the  
 28 clerk only if the clerk has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each calendar

29 year relating to the operations of the clerk's office when approved by a professional association  
30 of the county clerks of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the professional  
31 association. The professional association approving the program shall provide a certificate of  
32 completion to each clerk who completes the training program and shall send a list of certified  
33 clerks to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for attending the training session [may]  
34 **shall** be reimbursed to the county clerk in the same manner as other expenses as may be  
35 appropriated for that purpose.

36 3. [The county clerk may retain any fees to which he is entitled for services performed  
37 in the issuance of fish and game licenses or permits.

38 4.] The county clerk in any county, other than a first classification charter county or a  
39 first classification county not having a charter form of government and not containing any part  
40 of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, shall not, except upon two-thirds  
41 vote of all the members of the salary commission, receive an annual compensation in an amount  
42 less than the total compensation being received for the office of county clerk in the particular  
43 county for services rendered or performed on the date the salary commission votes.

**51.283. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the election  
2 authority in each county that does not have a board of election commissioners shall receive  
3 additional compensation of seven thousand five hundred dollars annually for duties  
4 performed in compliance with the Help America Vote Act of 2002.**

52.269. 1. In all counties, except first classification counties having a charter form of  
2 government and first classification counties not having a charter form of government and not  
3 containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, the county  
4 collector shall receive an annual salary which shall be paid in equal monthly installments by the  
5 county. The salary shall be computed on an assessed valuation basis, **without regard to  
6 modifications due to the existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100,  
7 RSMo**, as provided in this subsection. The assessed valuation factor shall be the amount as  
8 shown for the year next preceding the annual salary computation. A county collector subject to  
9 the provisions of this section shall not receive an annual compensation less than the total  
10 compensation being received by the county collector in that county for services rendered or  
11 performed for the period beginning March 1, 1987, and ending February 29, 1988. The county  
12 collector shall receive the same percentage adjustments provided by the county salary  
13 commissions for county officers in that county pursuant to section 50.333, RSMo. The  
14 provisions of this section shall not permit or require a reduction in the amount of compensation  
15 being paid for the office of county collector on January 1, [1997] **2004**, or less than the total  
16 compensation being received for the services rendered or performed for the period beginning  
17 [March 1, 1987, and ending February 29, 1988] **January 1, 2004**. The salary shall be computed

38 2. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to the  
 39 collector only if the collector has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each  
 40 calendar year relating to the operations of the collector's office when approved by a professional  
 41 association of the county collectors of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the  
 42 professional association. The professional association approving the program shall provide a  
 43 certificate of completion to each collector who completes the training program and shall send  
 44 a list of certified collectors to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for attending the  
 45 training session [may] **shall** be reimbursed to the county collector in the same manner as other  
 46 expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

47 3. Any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding, any fee provided for in section  
 48 52.250 or 52.275, when collected on ditch and levee taxes, shall not be collected on behalf of the  
 49 county and deposited into the county general revenue fund. Such fee shall be retained by the  
 50 collector as compensation for his services, in addition to any amount provided for such collector  
 51 in this section. [Any fee which may be retained by the collector under the terms of such contract  
 52 may be retained in addition to all other compensation provided by law.]

53 4. Except as provided in subsection 3 of this section, after the next general election



54 following January 1, 1988, all fees collected by the collector shall be collected on behalf of the  
 55 county and deposited in the county general revenue fund.

53.082. 1. The county assessor in any county, other than in a first classification county,  
 2 shall receive an annual salary computed as set forth in the following schedule provided in this  
 3 subsection. **The salary shall be computed on an assessed valuation basis, without regard**  
 4 **to modifications due to the existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100,**  
 5 **RSMo, as provided in this subsection.** The assessed valuation factor shall be the amount  
 6 thereof as shown for the year next preceding the computation. The provisions of this section  
 7 shall not permit or require a reduction in the amount of compensation being paid for the office  
 8 of assessor on [September 1, 1997] **January 1, 2004.**

28 2. The compensation for county assessors in second, third and fourth classification  
 29 counties for the term of office beginning September 1, [1997] **2005**, shall be calculated pursuant  
 30 to the salary schedule in this section using the percentage increase approved by the county salary  
 31 commission when establishing the compensation for the office of county assessor at the salary  
 32 commission meeting in [1997] **2005**. This salary shall become effective on September 1, [1997]  
 33 **2005.**

34 3. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to the

35 assessor only if the assessor has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each  
 36 calendar year relating to the operations of the assessor's office when approved by a professional  
 37 association of the county assessors of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the  
 38 professional association. The professional association approving the program shall provide a  
 39 certificate of completion to each assessor who completes the training program and shall send a  
 40 list of certified assessors to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for attending the  
 41 training session [may] **shall** be reimbursed to the county assessor in the same manner as other  
 42 expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

43 4. The county assessor in any county, except a first classification county, shall not,  
 44 except upon two-thirds vote of all the members of the salary commission, receive an annual  
 45 compensation in an amount less than the total compensation being received for the office of  
 46 county assessor in the particular county for services rendered or performed on the date the salary  
 47 commission votes.

54.261. 1. The county treasurer in counties of the first classification, not having a charter  
 2 form of government and containing a portion of a city with a population of three hundred  
 3 thousand or more, and in counties of the second, third and fourth classifications of this state,  
 4 shall receive as compensation for services performed by the treasurer an annual salary based  
 5 upon the assessed valuation of the county. The provisions of this section shall not permit or  
 6 require a reduction[, nor shall require an increase,] in the amount of compensation being paid for  
 7 the office of treasurer on January 1, [2002] **2004**.

8 2. The amount of salary based upon assessed valuation shall be computed according to  
 9 the following schedule:
