AN ACT

2 To repeal sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 3 51.281, 52.269, 53.082, 54.261, 54.320, 4 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, 58.095, and 473.742, 7 RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof fourteen 6 new sections relating to maximum allowable 7 compensation for certain county officials.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI,9 AS FOLLOWS:

2. In addition to any compensation provided pursuant to
subsection 1 of this section, the presiding commissioner of any
county not having a charter form of government shall receive two
thousand dollars annual salary.

3. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this 8 section shall be payable to a commissioner only if the 9 10 commissioner has completed at least twenty hours of classroom 11 instruction each calendar year relating to the operations of the 12 commissioner's office when approved by a professional association 13 of the county commissioners of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the professional association. 1 more, shall not, except upon a two-thirds vote of all the members 2 of the salary commission, receive an annual compensation in an 3 amount less than the total compensation being received for the 4 office of county commissioner or presiding commissioner 5 respectively for the particular county for services rendered or 6 performed on the date the salary commission votes.

7 50.334. 1. In all counties, except counties of the first classification having a charter form of government and counties 8 of the first classification not having a charter form of 9 10 government and not containing any part of a city with a 11 population of three hundred thousand or more, each recorder of 12 deeds, if the recorder's office is separate from that of the 13 circuit clerk, shall receive as total compensation for all services performed by the recorder, except as provided pursuant 14 15 to section 50.333, an annual salary which shall be computed on an 16 assessed valuation basis, without regard to modifications due to 17 the existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100, 18 RSMo, as set forth in the following schedule. The assessed 19 valuation factor shall be the amount thereof as computed for the 20 year next preceding the computation. 1 Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this 2. 2 section shall be payable to the recorder only if he has completed 3 at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each calendar year relating to the operations of the recorder's office when approved 4 5 by a professional association of the county recorders of deeds of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the professional 6 7 association. The professional association approving the program shall provide a certificate of completion to each recorder who 8 completes the training program and shall send a list of certified 9 10 recorders to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for attending the training session shall be reimbursed to the county 11 12 recorder in the same manner as other expenses as may be 13 appropriated for that purpose.

14 1. Other provisions of law to the contrary 50.343. notwithstanding, in any first classification nonchartered county, 15 16 including any county containing any part of a city with a 17 population of three hundred thousand or more, the annual salary 18 of a county recorder of deeds, clerk, auditor, county 19 commissioner, collector, treasurer, assessor or salaried public 20 administrator may be computed on an assessed valuation basis, 21 without regard to modifications due to the existence of 22 enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100, RSMo, as set forth in the following schedule except as provided in [subsection 23 24 2] subsections 2 and 3 of this section. The assessed valuation 25 factor shall be the amount thereof as shown for the year next

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preceding the computation. The provisions of this section shall not permit a reduction in the amount of compensation being paid on January 1, [1997] 2004, for any of the offices subject to this section on January 1, [1997] 2004.

3 (2) Presiding commissioners shall receive a salary of two 4 thousand dollars more than the salary received by the associate 5 commissioners.

After December 31, 1990, in any county of the second 2. 6 classification which becomes a first classification county 7 without a charter form of government, the annual compensation of 8 county recorder of deeds, clerk, auditor, county commissioner, 9 10 collector, treasurer, assessor and the public administrator in 11 counties where the public administrator is paid a salary under 12 the provisions of section 473.740, RSMo, may be set at the option 13 of the salary commission. On or before October first of the year immediately prior to the beginning of the county fiscal year 14 15 following the general election after the certification by the 16 state equalizing agency that the county possesses an assessed 17 valuation placing it in first classification status, the salary 18 commission shall meet for the purpose of setting compensation for 19 such county offices or officials and such compensation shall be 20 payable immediately except that no compensation of any county 21 office or county official shall be reduced and the compensation of presiding county commissioners in any of such counties shall 22 23 be two thousand dollars more than the compensation paid to the associate commissioners in that county. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this 18 2. section shall be payable to the clerk only if the clerk has 19 20 completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each calendar year relating to the operations of the clerk's office 21 22 when approved by a professional association of the county clerks 23 of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the professional 24 association. The professional association approving the program 25 shall provide a certificate of completion to each clerk who

completes the training program and shall send a list of certified clerks to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for attending the training session [may] shall be reimbursed to the county clerk in the same manner as other expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

6 3. [The county clerk may retain any fees to which he is 7 entitled for services performed in the issuance of fish and game 8 licenses or permits.

The professional association approving

the program shall provide a certificate of completion to each collector who completes the training program and shall send a list of certified collectors to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for attending the training session [may] shall be reimbursed to the county collector in the same manner as other expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

7 Any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding, 3. any fee provided for in section 52.250 or 52.275, when collected 8 9 on ditch and levee taxes, shall not be collected on behalf of the 10 county and deposited into the county general revenue fund. Such 11 fee shall be retained by the collector as compensation for his 12 services, in addition to any amount provided for such collector in this section. [Any fee which may be retained by the collector 13 14 under the terms of such contract may be retained in addition to 15 all other compensation provided by law.]
