SENATE BILL NO. 1220

AN ACT

2 To repeal sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343,
 3 51.281, 52.269, 53.082, 54.261, 54.320,
 4 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, 58.095, and 473.742,
 5 RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof fourteen
 6 new sections relating to maximum allowable
 7 compensation for certain county officials.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI,
 9 AS FOLLOWS:

10 Section A. Sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 51.281, 52.269,
 11 53.082, 54.261, 54.320, 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, 58.095, and
 12 473.742, RSMo, are repealed and fourteen new sections enacted in
 13 lieu thereof, to be known as sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343,
 14 51.281, 51.283, 52.269, 53.082, 54.261, 54.320, 55.091, 56.265,
 15 57.317, 58.095, and 473.742, to read as follows:

16 49.082. 1. A county commissioner in any county, other than
 17 in a first classification chartered county or a first
 18 classification county not having a charter form of government and
 19 not containing any part of a city with a population of three

hundred thousand or more, shall, subject to any other adjustment otherwise provided in this section, receive an annual salary computed, without regard to modifications due to the existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100, RSMo, as set forth in the following schedule. The assessed valuation factor shall be the amount thereof as shown for the year next preceding the computation. The provisions of this section shall not permit or require a reduction in the amount of compensation being paid for the office of commissioner on January 1, [1997] 2004.

2. In addition to any compensation provided pursuant to subsection 1 of this section, the presiding commissioner of any county not having a charter form of government shall receive two thousand dollars annual salary.

3. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to a commissioner only if the commissioner has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each calendar year relating to the operations of the commissioner's office when approved by a professional association of the county commissioners of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the professional association. The professional association approving the program shall provide a certificate of completion to each commissioner who completes the training program and shall send a list of certified commissioners to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for attending the training session [may] shall be reimbursed to a county commissioner in the same manner as other expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

4. A county commissioner in any county, other than a first classification charter county or a first classification county not having a charter form of government and not containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or

1 more, shall not, except upon a two-thirds vote of all the members
2 of the salary commission, receive an annual compensation in an
3 amount less than the total compensation being received for the
4 office of county commissioner or presiding commissioner
5 respectively for the particular county for services rendered or
6 performed on the date the salary commission votes.

7 50.334. 1. In all counties, except counties of the first
8 classification having a charter form of government and counties
9 of the first classification not having a charter form of
10 government and not containing any part of a city with a
11 population of three hundred thousand or more, each recorder of
12 deeds, if the recorder's office is separate from that of the
13 circuit clerk, shall receive as total compensation for all
14 services performed by the recorder, except as provided pursuant
15 to section 50.333, an annual salary which shall be computed on an
16 assessed valuation basis, without regard to modifications due to
17 the existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100,
18 RSMo, as set forth in the following schedule. The assessed
19 valuation factor shall be the amount thereof as computed for the
20 year next preceding the computation. The county recorder of
21 deeds whose office is separate from that of the circuit clerk in
22 any county, other than a county of the first classification
23 having a charter form of government or a county of the first
24 classification not having a charter form of government and not
25 containing any part of a city with a population of three hundred

thousand or more, shall not, except upon two-thirds vote of all the members of the salary commission, receive an annual compensation in an amount less than the total compensation being received for the office of county recorder of deeds in the particular county for services rendered or performed on January 1, [1997] 2004.

1 2. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this
2 section shall be payable to the recorder only if he has completed
3 at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each calendar year
4 relating to the operations of the recorder's office when approved
5 by a professional association of the county recorders of deeds of
6 Missouri unless exempted from the training by the professional
7 association. The professional association approving the program
8 shall provide a certificate of completion to each recorder who
9 completes the training program and shall send a list of certified
10 recorders to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for
11 attending the training session shall be reimbursed to the county
12 recorder in the same manner as other expenses as may be
13 appropriated for that purpose.

14 50.343. 1. Other provisions of law to the contrary
15 notwithstanding, in any first classification nonchartered county,
16 including any county containing any part of a city with a
17 population of three hundred thousand or more, the annual salary
18 of a county recorder of deeds, clerk, auditor, county
19 commissioner, collector, treasurer, assessor or salaried public
20 administrator may be computed on an assessed valuation basis,
21 without regard to modifications due to the existence of
22 enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100, RSMo, as set
23 forth in the following schedule except as provided in [subsection
24 2] subsections 2 and 3 of this section. The assessed valuation
25 factor shall be the amount thereof as shown for the year next

preceding the computation. The provisions of this section shall not permit a reduction in the amount of compensation being paid on January 1, [1997] 2004, for any of the offices subject to this section on January 1, [1997] 2004.

3 (2) Presiding commissioners shall receive a salary of two
4 thousand dollars more than the salary received by the associate
5 commissioners.

6 2. After December 31, 1990, in any county of the second
7 classification which becomes a first classification county
8 without a charter form of government, the annual compensation of
9 county recorder of deeds, clerk, auditor, county commissioner,
10 collector, treasurer, assessor and the public administrator in
11 counties where the public administrator is paid a salary under
12 the provisions of section 473.740, RSMo, may be set at the option
13 of the salary commission. On or before October first of the year
14 immediately prior to the beginning of the county fiscal year
15 following the general election after the certification by the
16 state equalizing agency that the county possesses an assessed
17 valuation placing it in first classification status, the salary
18 commission shall meet for the purpose of setting compensation for
19 such county offices or officials and such compensation shall be
20 payable immediately except that no compensation of any county
21 office or county official shall be reduced and the compensation
22 of presiding county commissioners in any of such counties shall
23 be two thousand dollars more than the compensation paid to the
24 associate commissioners in that county. Thereafter in all such
25 counties the salary commission shall meet for the purpose of

1 setting the compensation of the offices or officers in this
2 subsection who will be elected at the next general election, and
3 such compensation shall be payable upon the beginning of the next
4 term of office of such offices or officers; except that, no
5 compensation of any office or officer shall be reduced and the
6 compensation of presiding county commissioners in any of such
7 counties shall be two thousand dollars more than the compensation
8 paid to the associate commissioners in that county. Two thousand
9 dollars of the compensation established under the procedures
10 authorized pursuant to this subsection shall be payable to a
11 county officer only if the officer has completed at least twenty
12 hours of classroom instruction in the operation of the office in
13 the same manner as provided by law for the offices and officers
14 subject to the provisions of section 50.333. At the salary
15 commission meeting which establishes the percentage rate to be
16 applied to the county offices or officers during the next term of
17 office, the salary commission may authorize the further
18 adjustment of such officers' compensation as a cost-of-living
19 component and effective January first of each year, the
20 compensation for county offices or officers may be adjusted by
21 the county commission, not to exceed the percentage increase
22 given to the other county employees.

23 3. [Other provisions of this section to the contrary
24 notwithstanding, at the option of a majority of the county salary
25 commission members, the salary of associate commissioners of a

1 county of the first classification without a charter form of
2 government with a population of at least eighty-two thousand but
3 not more than eighty-five thousand inhabitants may be set at no
4 more than sixty-five percent of the amount on the salary schedule
5 for the county affected] The compensation for county assessors in
6 counties of the first classification for the term of office
7 beginning September 1, 2005, shall be calculated under the salary
8 schedule in this section using the percentage increase approved
9 by the county salary commission when establishing the
10 compensation for the office of county assessor at the salary
11 commission meeting in 2005. This salary shall become effective
12 September 1, 2005.

13 51.281. 1. The county clerk in any county, other than in a
14 first classification county, shall receive an annual salary
15 computed as set forth in the following schedule. The salary
16 shall be computed on an assessed valuation basis, without regard
17 to modifications due to the existence of enterprise zones or
18 financing under chapter 100, RSMo, as provided in this
19 subsection. The assessed valuation factor shall be the amount
20 thereof as shown for the year next preceding the computation.
21 The provisions of this section shall not permit or require a
22 reduction in the amount of compensation being paid for the office
23 of clerk on January 1, [1997] 2004.

18 2. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this
 19 section shall be payable to the clerk only if the clerk has
 20 completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each
 21 calendar year relating to the operations of the clerk's office
 22 when approved by a professional association of the county clerks
 23 of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the professional
 24 association. The professional association approving the program
 25 shall provide a certificate of completion to each clerk who

1 completes the training program and shall send a list of certified
2 clerks to the treasurer of each county. Expenses incurred for
3 attending the training session [may] shall be reimbursed to the
4 county clerk in the same manner as other expenses as may be
5 appropriated for that purpose.

6 3. [The county clerk may retain any fees to which he is
7 entitled for services performed in the issuance of fish and game
8 licenses or permits.

9 4.] The county clerk in any county, other than a first
10 classification charter county or a first classification county
11 not having a charter form of government and not containing any
12 part of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or
13 more, shall not, except upon two-thirds vote of all the members
14 of the salary commission, receive an annual compensation in an
15 amount less than the total compensation being received for the
16 office of county clerk in the particular county for services
17 rendered or performed on the date the salary commission votes.

18 51.283. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
19 contrary, the election authority in each county that does not
20 have a board of election commissioners shall receive additional
21 compensation of seven thousand five hundred dollars annually for
22 duties performed in compliance with the Help America Vote Act of
23 2002.

24 52.269. 1. In all counties, except first classification
25 counties having a charter form of government and first

1 classification counties not having a charter form of government
2 and not containing any part of a city with a population of three
3 hundred thousand or more, the county collector shall receive an
4 annual salary which shall be paid in equal monthly installments
5 by the county. The salary shall be computed on an assessed
6 valuation basis, without regard to modifications due to the
7 existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100,
8 RSMo. as provided in this subsection. The assessed valuation
9 factor shall be the amount as shown for the year next preceding
10 the annual salary computation. A county collector subject to the
11 provisions of this section shall not receive an annual
12 compensation less than the total compensation being received by
13 the county collector in that county for services rendered or
14 performed for the period beginning March 1, 1987, and ending
15 February 29, 1988. The county collector shall receive the same
16 percentage adjustments provided by the county salary commissions
17 for county officers in that county pursuant to section 50.333,
18 RSMo. The provisions of this section shall not permit or require
19 a reduction in the amount of compensation being paid for the
20 office of county collector on January 1, [1997] 2004, or less
21 than the total compensation being received for the services
22 rendered or performed for the period beginning [March 1, 1987,
23 and ending February 29, 1988] January 1, 2004. The salary shall
24 be computed on the basis of the following schedule:

19 2. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this
 20 section shall be payable to the collector only if the collector
 21 has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each
 22 calendar year relating to the operations of the collector's
 23 office when approved by a professional association of the county
 24 collectors of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the
 25 professional association. The professional association approving

1 the program shall provide a certificate of completion to each
2 collector who completes the training program and shall send a
3 list of certified collectors to the treasurer of each county.
4 Expenses incurred for attending the training session [may] shall
5 be reimbursed to the county collector in the same manner as other
6 expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

7 3. Any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding,
8 any fee provided for in section 52.250 or 52.275, when collected
9 on ditch and levee taxes, shall not be collected on behalf of the
10 county and deposited into the county general revenue fund. Such
11 fee shall be retained by the collector as compensation for his
12 services, in addition to any amount provided for such collector
13 in this section. [Any fee which may be retained by the collector
14 under the terms of such contract may be retained in addition to
15 all other compensation provided by law.]

16 4. Except as provided in subsection 3 of this section,
17 after the next general election following January 1, 1988, all
18 fees collected by the collector shall be collected on behalf of
19 the county and deposited in the county general revenue fund.

20 53.082. 1. The county assessor in any county, other than
21 in a first classification county, shall receive an annual salary
22 computed as set forth in the following schedule provided in this
23 subsection. The salary shall be computed on an assessed
24 valuation basis, without regard to modifications due to the
25 existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100,

RSMo, as provided in this subsection. The assessed valuation factor shall be the amount thereof as shown for the year next preceding the computation. The provisions of this section shall not permit or require a reduction in the amount of compensation being paid for the office of assessor on [September 1, 1997] January 1, 2004.

1 2. The compensation for county assessors in second, third
2 and fourth classification counties for the term of office
3 beginning September 1, [1997] 2005, shall be calculated pursuant
4 to the salary schedule in this section using the percentage
5 increase approved by the county salary commission when
6 establishing the compensation for the office of county assessor
7 at the salary commission meeting in [1997] 2005. This salary
8 shall become effective on September 1, [1997] 2005.

9 3. Two thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this
10 section shall be payable to the assessor only if the assessor has
11 completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each
12 calendar year relating to the operations of the assessor's office
13 when approved by a professional association of the county
14 assessors of Missouri unless exempted from the training by the
15 professional association. The professional association approving
16 the program shall provide a certificate of completion to each
17 assessor who completes the training program and shall send a list
18 of certified assessors to the treasurer of each county. Expenses
19 incurred for attending the training session [may] shall be
20 reimbursed to the county assessor in the same manner as other
21 expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose.

22 4. The county assessor in any county, except a first
23 classification county, shall not, except upon two-thirds vote of
24 all the members of the salary commission, receive an annual
25 compensation in an amount less than the total compensation being

received for the office of county assessor in the particular county for services rendered or performed on the date the salary commission votes.

54.261. 1. The county treasurer in counties of the first classification, not having a charter form of government and containing a portion of a city with a population of three hundred thousand or more, and in counties of the second, third and fourth classifications of this state, shall receive as compensation for services performed by the treasurer an annual salary based upon the assessed valuation of the county, without regard to modifications due to the existence of enterprise zones or financing under chapter 100, RSMo. The provisions of this section shall not permit or require a reduction[, nor shall require an increase,] in the amount of compensation being paid for the office of treasurer on January 1, [2002] 2004.

2. The amount of salary based upon assessed valuation shall be computed according to the following schedule:
