

House Concurrent Resolution No. 33

92ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Whereas, three years after women won the right to vote, the Equal Rights Amendment to the United States Constitution, authored by Alice Paul, head of the National Women's Party, was introduced in Congress by Senator Curtis and Representative Anthony, both Republicans; and

Whereas, the Equal Rights Amendment to the United States Constitution passed the United States Senate and then the United States House of Representatives, and on March 22, 1972, the proposed Amendment to the United States Constitution was sent to the states for ratification; and

Whereas, the Equal Rights Amendment to the United States Constitution states:

 "Section 1. Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex.

 Section 2. The Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article.

 Section 3. This amendment shall take effect two years after the date of ratification."; and

Whereas, Congress placed a deadline of June 30, 1982, on the ratification process and thirty-five states ratified the proposed Amendment before the deadline; and

22 **Whereas**, Congress may not have the constitutional authority to place a deadline
23 on the ratification process; and

25 **Whereas**, Article V of the United States Constitution allows the General Assembly
26 of the State of Missouri to ratify this proposed Amendment to the Constitution of the United
27 States; and

29 **Whereas**, the General Assembly of the State of Missouri finds that the proposed
30 Amendment is meaningful and needed as part of the United States Constitution and that the
31 present political, social and economic conditions are the same as or are even more demanding
32 today than they were when the proposed Amendment was first submitted for adoption:

34 **Now, therefore, be it resolved** by the Missouri House of
35 Representatives, Ninety-second General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Missouri Senate
36 concurring therein, that the Equal Rights Amendment to the United States Constitution is hereby
37 ratified; and

39 **Be it further resolved** that the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives
40 be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the Archivist of the
41 United States, Washington, D.C.; the Vice President of the United States; the Speaker of the
42 United States House of Representatives; and each member of the Missouri Congressional
43 Delegation with request that it be printed in the Congressional Record
