AN ACT

To repeal section 171.171, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to school credit.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 171.171, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 171.171, RSMo, to read as follows:

171.171. 1. Work completed in schools accredited by the state board of education shall
be given full credit in requirements for entrance to and classification in any educational
institution supported in whole or in part by state appropriation.

4 2. When a student transfers into an accredited public school district from an unaccredited public or nonpublic school, or from a home school, the district shall provide 5 the student and parent or guardian with a written explanation of the enrollment, credit 6 7 issuance, grade level placement, and appeal process along with the board policy on these topics. The district shall review the student's course work, achievement test scores, 8 9 transcript, and any other performance data from his or her previous school, including any records kept pursuant to section 167.031, RSMo, to determine the issuing of course credits 10 and grade level placement. If the district is unable to determine the credits earned or 11 12 grade level placement based on the documentation provided, the district may administer some other proficiency assessment as set by school board policy. If the assessment selected 13 14 by the district is not a recognized national or state assessment, course curricular objectives 15 shall be provided to the student and parent or guardian prior to the test. Course credit 16 shall be awarded based on a passing grade determined by what is considered passing to regularly enrolled students in the district. The district shall provide a determination of the 17

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18 course credits and grade level placement to the student and his or her parent or guardian

within thirty calendar days of the request for enrollment and provision of coursedocumentation by the student and parent or guardian.

21 3. Board of education policies for determining the issuance of credits and grade 22 level placement of transfer students shall be reasonable and nondiscriminatory. Elective credit may be awarded for religious course work or other course work not recognized as 23 24 fulfilling the district curricular objectives but which meet the documentation requirements 25 of this section or section 167.031, RSMo, as applicable. The district shall work with the 26 student and the student's parents or guardian to determine the best grade level placement 27 based on the credits earned and the student's age, and devise a program of studies that, if 28 completed, will earn a high school diploma.
