FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal specifies that anti-kickback laws relating to referrals for health care services do not apply to certain programs established by pharmaceutical companies to provide financial assistance to individuals with chronic, potentially debilitating, or life-threatening conditions who have been prescribed disease-managing medications for which there is no generic equivalent. Nonprofit organizations with more than five years of experience serving members with chronic, potentially debilitating, or life-threatening conditions are not prohibited from arranging, seeking, or promoting access to needed medical care, equipment, or medications for their members.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
