FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

Under current law, a victim of crime has the right to be informed of proceedings involving his or her case and the prosecution and incarceration of the offender. The proposed legislation would clarify that a victim must be notified of any decision by a circuit court regarding the release of the offender to enter a drug treatment program or the release of a first-time, nonviolent offender after 120 days of incarceration, upon the recommendation of the Department of Corrections.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
