FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTIONS

Officials of the **Missouri Department of Conservation** stated that the direct effect of the proposal on their Department is unknown.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** (SOS) stated that statewide newspaper publication of constitutional amendments would cost approximately \$1,289 per column inch per publication date based on an estimate provided by the Missouri Press Service. The SOS estimated this proposal would require 10 column inches including title header and certification paragraph, for three required publications. $((\$1,289 \times 3 = \$3,867) \times 10 = \$38,670)$. These costs are based on 2004 figures and are subject to change.

Oversight assumes the referendum called for in this proposal would be held in conjunction with the November 2006 general election. Oversight also assumes that the proposal, if enacted, would not have a significant impact on any state agency of fund.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


DESCRIPTION

This proposal would call for a referendum to be held in conjunction with the general election in November 2006, or at a special election called by the Governor, to create a constitutional right to hunt, fish, and harvest game.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
