FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Transportation**, **Department of Corrections**, and the **Department of Public Safety** – divisions of **Missouri State Highway Patrol** and **Director's Office** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** assume the proposal would not have a significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors.

Officials from the **Office of the State Public Defender (SPD)** assume existing staff could provide representation for those few cases arising where indigent persons were charged with displaying adult entertainment films in vehicles where children could view them. Passage of more than one bill increasing penalties on existing crimes or creating new crimes would require the SPD to request increased appropriations to cover the cumulative cost of representing indigent persons accused in the now more serious cases or in the new additional cases.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation creates the crime of displaying an adult entertainment film in a motor vehicle, a class C misdemeanor. The crime is committed when a person operating a motor vehicle allows the displaying of an adult entertainment film within the vehicle in a manner which enables a child to view any part of the film.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
