FISCAL ANALYSIS

<u>ASSUMPTION</u>

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** state the proposal gives the Missouri Dental Board the authority to promulgate rules to regulate the use of dental assistants, certified dental assistants, or expanded-functions dental assistants to remove hard and soft deposits. These rules will be published in the Missouri Register and the Code of State Regulations. Based on experience with other divisions, the rules, regulations and forms issued by the Missouri Dental Board could require as many as 20 pages in the Code of State Regulations. For any given rule, roughly one-half again as many pages are published in the Missouri Register as are published in the Code because of cost statements, fiscal notes and notices that are not published in the Code. The estimated cost of a page in the Missouri Register is \$23. The estimated cost of a page in the Code of State Regulations is \$27. The actual cost could be more or less than the numbers given. The impact of this legislation in future years is unknown and depends upon the frequency and length of rules, filed, amended, rescinded, and withdrawn. The SOS estimates the cost of the proposal to be \$1,230 [(20 pgs. X \$27) + (30 pgs. X \$23)] for FY 06.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process. Any decisions to raise fees to defray costs would likely be made in subsequent fiscal years.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal may impact small business dentist offices in third class counties.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal allows dental assistants, practicing within third classification counties, to perform certain cleaning procedures provided they meet specific educational and training criteria.

The Missouri Dental Board is authorized to develop rules to regulate dental assistants performing these procedures.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
